JUNIOR TITLES SPLIT FOR 2000

The SDCA held an E-mail meeting of its board of directors to determine how to hold the South Dakota Junior Championship for 2000. The board decided that it would hold a South Dakota Junior Open on May 20, 2000 in Rapid City. The South Dakota Junior normally held in conjunction with the South Dakota Closed will be a two day invitational event held at the same time as the South Dakota Closed. The top 25 juniors on the June 2000 rating list will be invited. Both the winner of the South Dakota Junior Open Division and the South Dakota Junior Invitational winner will be considered South Dakota Junior Champions for 2000.

Two reasons for holding a junior in West River in May are to give the new West River players an opportunity to play in another SDCA chess tournament and another chance to play while school is in session. The South Dakota Scholastic Championship were held for the 4th year at O'Gorman High School with a record number of participants including 28 from West River. The dominance of the Sioux Falls Home School Association was clearly shown in their performance at State. They won three team titles and

had three individual champion. Sioux Falls Mark Twain had beaten them in k-6 sections of previous tournaments and Sioux Falls O'Gorman Junior High and Sioux Falls Patrick Henry had beaten them in the K-9 sections of the Sioux Falls Scholastic and Sioux Falls Regional. But, the addition of Isaac Gerdes to the Middle School Team and the performance of Ruth Glader put them over the top. Madison showed up to defend its K-12 title and had a chance to do so until the last round when Sioux Falls Lincoln finished 4-0. Michael Began will be representing South Dakota at the Arnold Denker Tournament of High School Champions in St. Paul as the South Dakota High School Champion.

There are some issues regarding South Dakota scholastic chess which need to be discussed by the Scholastic Committee and the SDCA. Should we separate the High School Tournament from the rest of the tournament and should we make that tournament a 2 day tournament? Should the South Dakota Scholastic championship be moved to another site? Should that site be in Sioux Falls or should it be in Pierre, Chamberlain, or Rapid City in order to accommodate non-Sioux Falls players? Should the team tournament be separate from the individual championship like Nebraska does? Should we be refusing money from the Sioux Empire Chess Foundation for trophies or for room rental? Should we raise the age of juniors to 19 and under to match the USCF? Should we provide for division of large teams to ease pairing problems? What format should the South Dakota Junior have? Should we require scholastics to join the SDCA? What form should the regional scholastics take? The Sioux Empire Chess Foundation has expressed its concern that the SDCA is not compensating its tournament directors at direct SDCA events. Nels Truelson plans to revisit the issue of playoffs at the South Dakota Scholastic. These questions and the future of the South Dakota Junior hopefully will be discussed at the SDCA meeting on June 11,2000 at Cedar Shores Resort, Oacoma

Sioux Falls Lincoln Wins Chess Championship Bergan Wins Individual Title

Mike Bergan of Madison garnered a perfect five-wins-and-no-losses record in the South Dakota State High School Championship Tournament, Saturday, to earn the individual scholastic chess title. The event was held at

O'Gorman High School in Sioux Falls as part of the State K-12 Scholastic Chess Championships. Over 100 players were in attendance.

The Madison team, attempting to defend the state title it has held for two years running, entered into a seesaw battle with Sioux Falls Lincoln from the first round. Lincoln opened with four wins in the first to Madison's three, but Madison came storming back in the second round to pick up four wins while Lincoln managed only one to give the locals a 7-5 edge. Andrew Lindsay, and Mike and John Bergan each won their second games in a row in that round, while A. J. Severson added the seventh team win with his first and only win of the day. Spirits were high at this point, but round three witnessed a reversal of fortune, as Lincoln pulled ahead nine to eight in spite of wins by Josh Fritz and Mike Bergan. In round four, Mike won his fourth in a row while his younger brother, John, won his third game out of four to pull Madison back into a dead heat with Lincoln, at ten team wins each. But in the final round, only the elder Bergan was equal to the occasion, capturing a win while his five teammates lost. Steve Cahill, Goran Petrovic, Duy Nguyen, and Scott Wrotenbury all won for Lincoln, giving them a total of 14 team wins to Madison's 11 and the State High School Team Championship. O'Gorman High School, led by Kevin Truckenmiller and Matt Jordahl, each 3 - 2, finished third with 10.5 team points. Steve Cahill and Goran Petrovic each had 4 wins and 1 loss for Lincoln.

In the final round when Mike Bergan, the current State Junior Champ, met Mark Knudson of Sioux Falls Washington, the current overall SD State Champion, the battle between the long-time chess rivals proved to be all that was expected. Knudson, playing white, used his standard Bishop's Opening and Bergan replied with a symmetrical defense. The two Titans maneuvered warily for 16 moves when Knudson, seeing that Bergan's queen was momentarily out of play, initiated a king-side pawn advance, planning to blow Bergan's defenses away from his king, but at the expense of exposing his own monarch to danger. Bergan, perceiving a tactical advantage, sacrificed his knight for two pawns and the fireworks Bergan. His assessment proved correct, and he eventually won back the lost material and gained an immanent mate threat. The tenacious Knudson, however, pulled rabbit after rabbit out of his magician's hat, and ended up threatening a perpetual check, which would have given him a draw. Bergan shuffled his king to safety, however, and with less than two minutes remaining on each clock, he administered the coupe de grace. It was a magnificent game by both players. SIoux FALLS HOME SCHOOL ASSOCIATION TRIUMPHS AT SOUTH DAKOTA STATE SCHOLASTIC CHAMPIONSHIP

The Sioux Falls Home School Association won three of 4 divisions at the South Dakota State scholastic Championship on March 18,2000 at Sioux Falls O'Gorman in Sioux Falls. A record one-hundred forty-one players from forty-seven teams participated. Sioux Falls Lincoln led by Steve Cahill and Goran Petrovic unseated the 1998-9 teams champion Madison in the High School Section. Michael Bergan of Madison, current State Junior Champion took first place beating two-time champion and present South Dakota State

Champion Mark Knudson of Sioux Falls Washington in the final game of the day. Michael Bergan as South Dakota State High School Champion will represent South Dakota in the Arnold Denker Tournament of High School Champions which is being held in St. Paul, Minnesota in August 2000. Madison which only had two players early in the week preceding the tournament placed second while host Sioux Falls O'Gorman took third place. Sioux Falls Home School Association led by Daniel Haggard and John Shrader who took 4th and 5th places finished 4th a half point back of O'Gorman.

When Isaac Gerdes was changed from K-12 to K-9, it meant that a team that was already the favorite to win the title became unbeatable. Four home schoolers finished with at least 4 points. Isaac Gerdes who won or tied for the K-6 title the last two years easily won the K-9 title despite only being a 5th grader. Sioux Falls Patrick Henry which was led by Ba Nguyen (2nd) and Joe Waters (4) was hampered by the fact that their 4th player showed up at 1:00pm because he did not know that the tournament started at 9:00am, finished in third place. Waters and Nguyen's only losses were to Isaac Gerdes. Pierre Indian Learning Center showed that its win in the Middle School Division of the Black Hills Scholastic was not a fluke, taking 2nd place again at State.

The chances of Sioux Falls O'Gorman Junior High School which had won the Sioux Falls City Scholastic were greatly diminished when only two of five players attended the tournament. The two who played (Steve Blubaugh and Michael Elson) finished with 4 and 3.5 apiece.

The biggest surprise was the success of the Sioux Falls Home School Association in the K-6 Division. They had been beaten by Sioux Falls Mark Twain at the Governor's Cup, Sioux Falls City Scholastic and the Sioux Falls Regional Scholastic, but the play of Rachel Glader and Timothy Sax put the Home Schoolers over the top. Sioux Falls Mark Twain Elementary finished in second place 2.5 points back. Mark Twain led the Home Schoolers 13-12.5 going into the last round. The Home Schoolers went 4-0 in the last round while Mark Twain went 1-3. Home Schoolers won the two head-to-head matches in the final round as Nicholas Truelson beat Sam Waters and Jordan Gerdes beat Daniel Rainbow. This was third straight year that Sioux Falls Home School Association has won of the K-6 Division.

Mark Twain was hampered by the fact that Brandon Griesse who took the 3rd place trophy in the Sioux Falls Regional became sick during his 3rd round game. Rapid City Southwest Middle School which won the Black Hills Scholastic Elementary Team Title finished in third place. Nicholas Truelson who has lost only three games in his last 7 tournaments, winning 5 tournaments and finishing 3rd and 4th at the Governor's Cup and Eye Open III Reserve Section in the process, won the K-6 division, beating 3 Mark Twain players including a last round win over 2nd place winner Sam Waters. Jordan Hislaw of Pierre Indian Learning Center took 3rd place with a backrank mate in the last round. Zachary Abrahamson of Rapid City Southwest Middle School who won the Black Hills Scholastic Elementary Division was fourth on tiebreak. Jordan Gerdes recovered from a third round

loss to Brandt Abeln to end up in fifth place.

As expected Home Schoolers took the top 3 places and the team title in the Primary(K-3)Division. Andrew Glader beat Taryn Gerdes in the last round to determine 1st and 2nd Place. This was Andrew's third straight first place trophy. Zachary Truelson who stumbled in an early round game finished third. Alex Chov of Sioux Falls John Harris finished fourth with 3 points while Ryan Brandt of Sioux Falls Mark Twain was awarded fifth place on tiebreak over the pre-tournament favorite John Lind of Rapid City Corral Drive Elementary. Sioux Falls Home School Association won the team title while Pierre Indian Learning Center took second place in the team competition. Two new players Matthew and Daniel Shultz of Sioux Falls Robert Frost helped their school to the 3rd place trophy.

Our thanks to Sam Ogdie and Sioux Falls O'Gorman for the use of their site for the fourth straight year. We really appreciate the parents and coaches who brought their players to the tournament. They were very well behaved despite cramped conditions being confined to the hallway for the entire tournament. This year we had twenty-eight players from West River. Nearly all of these players had played in their first tournament at the Black Hills Scholastic which was organized by Eric Abrahamson and Dr. Kumar and directed by Terry and Jill Likens. We also had twenty-eight players from Pierre including 26 from the Pierre Indian Learning Center. This year the tournament was directed by Terry Likens, Wes Schmidt, Jill Likens and Kurt Carlson, but without the help of De Knudson, Greg Waters, Mark Gerdes, Don Haggar, Mark Derby, and Dan Merchant the tournament would not have been possible.

Nels Truelson of Sioux Falls, South Dakota won the 16th Annual Revival of the Sioux Falls Open held April 15-16, 2000 at the Sioux Falls Labor Temple. Tying for 2nd and 3rd places were Mike Sailer of Fargo,ND; Curtis Carroll of Eagle Butte, SD; Bruce Draney,Omaha,NE; and Lyle Hanson, Watertown, SD. Serif Suljic, Sioux Falls, SD; Jose Gatica, Ames,IA; and Mark Knudson, Sioux Falls, SD tied for 1st Class B Finishing first in Class C was Steve Cahill, Sioux Falls, SD. There was a tie between Daniel Haggar, Sioux Falls, SD and Heath Draney, Omaha, NE for 1st Class D. Isaac Gerdes, Renner,SD took 1st Class E. Thirty three players from five states played in the Open Section.

The Reserve Section was won by Nicholas Truelson of Sioux Falls Home School B. Jenna Haggar of Sioux Falls Home School A finished second, while Jordan Gerdes of Sioux Falls Home School A finished in 3rd Place.
