Editor's Letter

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Schedule

5th Annual Governor's Cup-September 29 - October 1, 2000. The Sioux Empire Chess Foundation will present its 5th Annual Governor's Cup from September 29-October 1, 2000. The event will kick off with a thirty board simultaneous from 5-9pm, Thursday, September 28 in the Sears Wing of the Empire Mall given by GM Sergi Kudrin. There will be no charge, but it will be first to arrive, first to play. You should arrive by 4:45pm so that the event can kick off at 5pm. The Foundation has added over \$1,000 in prizes and doubled the amount paid for trophies in the Scholastic. Registration is from 4-5:30pm on Friday, September 29, 2000 with the 1st round at 6pm. The Saturday rounds will be at 10am and 4pm. The Blitz Tournament will begin at 9pm on Saturday. Scholastic registration will be from 7:30am - 8:30am on Saturday with rounds at 9-11-1-3-5. The Sunday rounds in the Governor's Cup will be at 9am and 3pm. We have commitments from GM's Kudrin, Wojtkiewicz and Blatny and IM John Donaldson. All will be available for school visits.

The SDCA held its annual events: the Western South Dakota Open, the Teams and the Closed. The Western was held in connection with the Junior Open. Attendance

was better at this event than in past events. Terry Likens and Dan Schmidt shared the Western SD Open while David Likens was awarded the title of South Dakota Open Champion. I hope that we can continue this event next year. The Grossmasters appeared for the third time in the teams. Wes Schmidt and Harry Overholtzer have played on all three editions. This time Jeff Barth played first board, allowing Harry Overholtzer, Bruce Brandt and Wes Schmidt to play one board lower than they played in 1997. As a result Harry Overholtzer and Wes Schmidt were able to sweep their board prizes with perfect scores. Nels Truelson of the Underdogs took the first board prize with 4.5 points while Mark Derby led the Brave to second place winning the third board prize. Pierre played well at times drawing with the Gossmasters, but the loss to the Brave ended their chances. Notable performances included Mike Thelen and Isaac Gerdes for the Brave with 3.5 points, Curtis Carroll and Bob Wallace with 3.5 points for Pierre and Jud Bergan with 3.5 points for Two Trophies, a Smart Guy and a Monkey. (Pretty good for a monkey.)

The SDCA meeting was long and contentious with timed speeches to prevent excessive rhetoric. At the end I am not sure that anyone was entirely happy with what occurred and some of the issues may be revisited next year.

Nels Truelson made sure of his title in the State Closed this time by beating Mark Knudson in the third round. Nels won all of his games for a perfect score, while Mark won all of the rest of his games to finish second. Nels was nearly drawn by Harry Overholtzer in Round 4, but Harry overlooked a hanging rook and defended a hanging pawn instead. Terry Likens and Curtis Carroll finished with 3.5 points. Daniel Haggar and Isaac Gerdes both juniors making their first appearance in the Closed played well. Daniel Haggar beat Terry Likens and drew with Curtis Carroll and Dan Schmidt. Isaac beat Serif Suljic, drew with Robert Wallace and had Curtis Carroll on the ropes before losing. 1st B was shared by Serif Suljic, Daniel Schmidt, Ranall Koeller 1st C was shared by Jerry Bergan and Daniel Haggar. 1st D went to Mark Gerdes. All of these players had three points. Other prizes were 1st Under 1200 Jim Thompson and Jonanvan Ottenbacher. Michael Bergan won the first and last Junior Invitational with playoff victory over Jordan Gerdes.

Many South Dakotans have played in the 1970's and early 1980's often compare the Sioux Falls Opens run by Gerald Mortimer with the Governor's Cups of the late 1990's. I attended a Sioux Falls Open in 1973, but none of the big tournaments. I am forced to rely on South Dakota Chess Bulletin from 1978-1981. Attendance for these years was as follows: 1978:75; 1979:93; 1980:120; 1981:91. The prize fund for 1979 was \$1725 while 1981 prize fund was \$2400. Each tournament had a simultaneous exhibition given by a titled player. 1978:IM William Martz (GM Walter Browne was supposed to come, but Augustana College forgot to send him a check so he did not come or notify the tournament director) 1979: GM Pal Benko 1980:GM Roman Dzindihashvilli; 1981: GM James Tarjan Benko did not play, but each of the other simul participants won the Open section in the year they gave their simul. Four experts and three masters played in the Open in 1979 while 11 experts and three masters played in 1981 open. Fifteen persons on our present rating list played either in 1979 or 1981. Almost all of these players increased their ratings between 1979 and 1981.

So the 1980 tournament was comparable to last years Governor's Cup in terms of numbers (excluding the scholastic), but not close in terms of prize fund or titled players. Thirty-six players from South Dakota played in 1979 while 31 South Dakotans played in 1981. (For comparasion see the statistics for Governor's Cup in the December 1999 SDCA Bulletin).

As with Governor's Cup, the Sioux Falls Open had one main organizer, Gerald Mortimer. Gerald Mortimer used his own money to supplement the entry fees in paying for the prize fund. I am told that the Sioux Falls Open ended in 1981 because Gerald had sold his partnership interest in the family farm implement dealership and he no longer was able to accept the financial loss of putting on the Sioux Falls Open. When Jeff Barth arrived in town in 1983, he wanted to reestablish the Sioux Falls Open. Gerald Mortimer tried to dissuade him because Gerry wanted to bring back the Sioux Falls Open on his own, but Jeff insisted and organized the 1985 Sioux Falls Open which has continued to this date.

We should take our hats off to the SD players of the late 70's and early 80's who organized a tournament comparable to the present Governor's Cup without sponsorship or nice venue.

Lastly, I did not make it to the US Open. David Knudson who was already attending as a player, agreed to attend the Delegate Meetings since he was our alternate delegate. Mark Knudson finished with 5 points in the Open and 1.5 in the Denker. Others SD players included Bruce Brandt with 4 points, Jim Thompson with 2.5 points and David Knudson with 2 points. Only 15 persons from South Dakota voted in the delegate election. De Knudson got 7 votes while her husband got 6 votes They will be our delegate and alternate at next years Delegates meeting. According to reports that I have read State will no longer receive ASAP money, Affilates will no longer be able to collect commissions, and dues will be raised for youth and scholastic players. US Chess Live, is now available to those who like to play chess on the internet and games played there could be rated. An internet only membership may soon beavailable with a form of Chess Life or School Mates available online. Hopefully, USCF will not go out of business despite continued ongoing losses. There will no more Grand Prix unless it can be funded from a source other than USCF.

Bruce Draney has produced some interesting statistics on his Omaha Chess website.

For South Dakota they show the following facts.

Bruce's premise is that the regular adult fee increase is responsible for a national downturn in tournament participation. These statistics do not track for South Dakota since our numbers went up while the national numbers went down. The present trend seems to be down.

Perhaps more telling is our membership numbers which are used to determine the number of delegates:

We are clearly on a downtrend which hopefully, newcomers like Eric Abrahamson, Nels Truelson, and our newest local TD can reverse.

2000 SDCA Annual Meeting Minutes June 11, 2000

Meeting was called to order by Terry Likens, SDCA President at approximately 8:00am. Minutes of the 1999 meeting were read by Jill Likens, SDCA Secretary-Treasurer -- for information and approval by the membership. Jill Likens gave the Treasurer's Report. The SDCA Savings Account has \$1152.40 and the SDCA Checking account has \$1240.55 for a total of \$2392.95. The Secretary's report included 30 Regular, 24 Junior and 6 Family memberships for a total of 73 members.

Reports from committees included a suggestion from Curtis Carroll stating that we should provide new players with a flyer including the USCF ethics guidelines. The Committee to establish options for a tournament of city champions had not met, but noted that there had only been two city championships this year. Wes Schmidt reviewed the success of the regional and state scholastic tournaments this year. He provided a list of several items for the Scholastic Committee to work on this year. Election of Officers and District Coordinators were completed with Terry Likens, Jud Bergan and Jill Likens running unopposed for the President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer positions respectively. Dan Merchant and Dan Schmidt were nominated to fill the District Coordinator positions for The Rest of the State and Rapid City Respectively. Nels Truelson and Mark Gerdes were nominated for the Sioux Falls Coordinator position with Mark Gerdes winning the vote.

Unfinished Business included the reports from the current committees. Jeff Barth moved to abolish the Ethics and Tournament of City Champions committees.

Discussion included a suggestion from Mark Gerdes to create a chess etiquette handout to give to new tournament players - especially junior players. The motion from Jeff passed.

New Business discussion began with several scholastic items. The first item "Should the High School section of the Scholastic Championship be held separately from the rest of the tournament and should the tournament be expanded to two days to allow for a slower time control?" led to much discussion. Mark Gerdes feels that the level of play is growing beyond the current g60 time control. Bruce Brandt agreed that by high school, players are more serious and this will help with the level of play. Nels Truelson stated that the tournament is growing and with the current format we will be meeting the problem of perfect scores, etc. Discussion continued and eventually it was moved to send this and several other scholastic issues to the Scholastic Committee.

The Scholastic Committee is comprised of Wes Schmidt, Jud Bergan, Jill Likens, Terry Likens, De Knudson and the District Coordinators - Dan Schmidt, Dan Merchant and Mark Gerdes. It was also suggested that Eric Abrahamson be included since he is the West River scholastic tournament organizer.

Other topics sent to the scholastic committee were: 1) Should the SD Scholastic Championship be moved to a different site? 2) Should there be a separate scholastic team championship? 3) Should we be refusing money from the Sioux Empire Chess Foundation for trophies or for room rental? 4) Should we allow for the division of large teams to ease pairing problems?

Discussion continued with items affecting the Bylaws. A motion was made to raise the age for Junior players to 19 and under to match USCF. The motion was amended to include that the cut-off for eligibility for the State Junior Championship would be the age "at the time of the tournament". The motion passed.

Wes Schmidt explained that our bylaws do not indicate whether our State Scholastic Championship is closed to SD residents. It was moved that we use the residency requirement per Article 3 Section 1 a to establish residency for the purposes of the Scholastic Championship. The motion passed.

The next topic was "How and when should the South Dakota Junior Championship be held?" After some discussion, it was moved that the South Dakota Junior Championship format return to a past format - with all players playing in the Closed and the highest placing Junior being named Junior Champion. The motion was amended to include that if the highest placing Junior also wins the Closed, he would receive both trophies and titles. This motion also passed. This format will go into effect for the 2001 Closed.

Dave Knudson explained that the Sioux Empire Chess Foundation is concerned that we are not compensating tournament directors for directing SDCA events. The Sioux Empire Chess Foundation would like to help with this compensation for scholastic events. The issue of TD's expenses for scholastic events was referred to the Scholastic committee to work out with the Sioux Empire Chess Foundation. The topic of compensating tournament directors for other SDCA events - the Teams Championship and the Closed - was also discussed. The motion was made to pay a \$50 director fee and to add \$150 for travel expenses for out of town tournaments. This motion passed.

Nels Truelson made a motion to add Article VI Section 10 stating: The SDCA shall neither award nor recognize any state chess titles that are decided by competition that is not open to all residents of South Dakota regardless of USCF rating - with the exception that the SDCA may award and recognize state class champions in competition restricted to specific rating classes. Discussion included the upcoming

Junior Invitational. An amendment was made to state that this change would not go into effect until after the Co-Junior champion is awarded and recognized. With this amendment, the motion passed with a close vote.

Nels went on to express concerns about Bylaws Article III, Section 3 which requires all SDCA voting members be USCF members. Some of the discussion included the voting rights of family members - which are currently kept in check with the USCF membership requirement. After much discussion, the motion failed with another close vote.

Jill Likens made a motion to create a scholastic membership fee of \$2 for junior players playing only in junior tournaments. With this suggestion came the idea of sending out a special abbreviated bulletin aimed at the younger players. David Knudson offered that the Sioux Empire Chess Foundation will fund such a bulletin. The motion was recinded and the topic of a scholastic chess bulletin was passed on to the the Scholastic Committee.

Nels Truelson made a motion to amend Bylaws - Article VI - Section 6 (a) to "... hold a playoff at the time control of Game/30 until a winner is determined. This time control may be shortened or lengthened with the unanimous consent of the playoff participants... and Bylaws Article VI Section 9 to state "The SDCA shall neither award nor recognize any state chess titles that are decided by a playoff match held at a time control shorter than Game/30, unless unanimous consent of the playoff participants is obtained. Nels supported his motion with much discussion including concerns about the legal issues (physical handicaps) and significance of the current playoff system - to use 5-minute speed chess games to break the tie. Much discussion followed. The motion passed.

Terry Likens made a motion to allow Patrick White - a junior player from Helett, Wyoming -- to be granted one year of state eligibility to allow him to play in closed state events. After limited discussion, the motion failed.

Wes Schmidt explained that Michael Bergan - the State High School Scholastic Champion will be unable to represent the state at the Arnold Denker Tournament of Champions. Mark Knudson won the play-off between players tied for second place. He is interested in representing the state and the motion carried for him to represent South Dakota. A motion followed to provide Mark with \$200 for expense money for the Arnold Denker tournament. This motion also passed.

Wes Schmidt motioned to change Constitution Article V Affiliation responsibilities to reword the appointment of a Delegate by the SDCA President to state that the President will follow USCF guidelines in providing for a Delegate to represent the State at the Annual Delegates meeting. The motion passed.

Dave Knudson invited everyone to come to the Governor's Cup on September 29 through October 1. He also shared the news that De will be the new Chairperson for the USCF Scholastic Committee.

Wes Schmidt will be our Delegate for the USCF Annual Meeting in St. Paul in August. He would like people to contact him with any items of interest or concern to bring to that meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at approximately 10:20am.

{Black's most aggressive response is also the riskiest. His early two-pawn center becomes a target for White's rapid development.}

4. Nf3 d5 5. exd5 cxd5 6. Bb3 Nc6 7. Bg5 Qa5+ 8. Nbd2 Bg4

{With the idea of forcing a weakening of White's pawns. In retrospect, however, White might stand better with the pawn at h3, in view of his dark squared bishop being confined to the king's side. Therefore, an immediate 8. ... Be6 could have been preferable.}

9. h3 Be6 10. O-O Nd7 11. Re1 f6 12. Bh4 O-O-O?

{Missing the strength of White's next move. Better was 12. ... Bc5, or even 12. ... Kf7!}

13. d4 e4?

Opening Black to a ferocious line of attack, but the alternatives also allowed White to break Black's center.

14. c3?

Putting Black back in the driver's seat. Powerful was 14. Nxe4! dxe4 15. Bxe6 exf3 16. Bg3! and Black is in a terrible bind.

14... Bg8 15. Nh2 g5 16. Bg3 f5 17. f4 Bd6 18. Rf1 Qc7 19. c4 gxf4

Black is naturally getting into time pressure, and was perhaps seeing ghosts of the previous year's Knudson v. Truelson encounter, where Mark won material on the c file due to the pin of the queen against the king. However, 19. ... Nxe4 was relatively safe, increasing the activity of Black's pieces and picking up a pawn with little risk.

20. Bh4 f3 21. Nhxf3 exf3 22. Nxf3

Not 22. Bxd8? Bh2+ 23. Kh1 fxg2+ 24. Kxg2 Qg3+ 25. Kh1 Qxh3 26. Rf2 dxc4 and White gets creamed

22... dxc4 23. Bxd8 Qxd8 24. Ba4

In this kind of open position, it is imperative that White deploys his last bishop to greater effect. 24. Bc2 was necessary, where after 24.... f4 25. Be4, the bishop can be used for both defense and offense.

24... Qb6?

Time pressure inaccuracy. 24.... Bd5 was called for.

25. Bxc6?

A sacrifice (yes, the bishop is far the better piece in this position) with no discernible compensation. White still should have played 25. Bc2 From this point on, he is almost certainly lost.

25... bxc6

The ostensible weakening of Black's pawns is of little import. By setting up a safe

cammp for his king a couple of squares away from the corner while securing the critical d5 square and opening eventual lines of play for his rook along the b file. Black prepares for the endgame.

26. Qc2 f4

While this restricts some attacking lines along the diagonal, the advance was necessary. Not only will Black need each pawn to achieve an endgame victory, but he also does not wish to give White open lines of attack along the f file with his rooks. As we shall see, the f pawn is also not without bite.

27. Kh1 Bd5 28. Rac1 h6 29. b3 cxb3 30. axb3 Kc7

Along with a good 45 seconds to spare, Black reaches the time control. All of Black's pieces have good lines of play, White's pawns are more vulnerable ,and for a material advantage,Black's bishops stare down White's rook, poised for first blood. This should be a very short contest.

31. Qf5 Qxb3 32. Ne5 Bxe5 33. dxe5 Rf8 34. Qh5 Qg3 35. Rc2 f3

RE-STATD CONSTITUTION OF THE SOUTH DAKOTA CHESS ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I Name - The name of this organization shall be the SOUTH DAKOTA CHESS ASSOCIATION which shall be referred to hereinafter as the SDCA or the Association.

ARTICLE II Duration - The Duration of the SDCA shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE III Membership - The SDCA is a membership organization. The exact terms, condition, rights, privileges and duties of membership are set forth in the BYLAWS OF THE SOUTH DAKOTA CHESS ASSOCIATION which are incorporated herein as if set out in full by this reference.

ARTICLE IV Purpose - The purpose of the SDCA shall be educational and instructional, to broaden and develop chess as an art and recreation, as a significant element of culture in America. The SDCA shall cooperate with schools, colleges, hospitals, military bases, community centers, recreation departments and other groups and institutions in teaching chess, conducting tournaments, and other activities. The SDCA shall disseminate information through its publications and representatives.

The SDCA is pledged:

(a)to operate exclusively for educational, recreational, and social welfare purposes.

(b)that no part of its contributions, dues, or net income shall inure to the benefit of any individual, except that trophies or prizes awarded in the course of its educational and promotional program shall not be so construed.

(c) that the SDCA is not operated for profit and that neither principal nor income of any of its fund shall be used to influence legislation.

ARTICLE V Affiliation - The SDCA shall be the affiliate of the United States Chess Federation for South Dakota designated as the State Chapter under Article IX., Section I of the Bylaws of the United States Chess Federation and shall perform all of the functions of the State Chapter as defined by the Bylaws of the United

States Chess Federation. The SDCA shall maintain its affiliation with the United States Chess Federation by paying the annual fee for affiliation required by the United States Chess Federation. The SDCA President will follow USCF guidelines in providing for a Delegate to officially represent the SDCA at the United States Chess Federation's Annual Delegates Meeting.

ARTICLE VI Government

Section 1 - The general management of the affairs of the SDCA shall be vested in a Board of Directors which shall consist of the officers of the SDCA, the Editor of the SDCA Bulletin and three district coordinators.

Section 2 - The officers of the SDCA shall consist of a President, a Vice-President and a Secretary-Treasurer.

Section 3 - All officers and district coordinators shall be elected at the annual meeting of the SDCA. A candidate for office receiving a majority of the votes cast shall be declared elected.

Section 4 - One District Coordinator shall be elected from each of the following three districts by receiving a majority of votes cast by voting members from each particular district who shall be present at the annual meeting:

- (a) Sioux Falls District consisting of the City of Sioux Falls.
- (b) Rapid City District consisting of the City of Rapid City.
- (c) The Rest of the State District consisting of all cities except Sioux Falls and Rapid City.

Section 5 - All officers shall be voting members of the SDCA as defined by the Bylaws of the SDCA. The Editor of the SDCA Bulletin will be a voting member of the SDCA. All district coordinators shall be voting members of the SDCA and a resident of their district at the time of their election.

Section 6 - A vacancy occurring in any office or district coordinator shall be filled for the unexpired term by a person elected by a majority vote of the remaining Board Members, notice of such election having been given. In case of a vacancy in the office of President, the Vice President shall serve notice of election.

ARTICLE VII Duties of Officers

Section 1 - The President shall preside at all meetings of the SDCA and Board of Directors at which he may be present; shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed in the Bylaws or assigned to him by the SDCA or Board of Directors and shall coordinate the work of the officers and committees of the SDCA in order that the purposes may be promoted.

Section 2 - The Vice President shall act as aide to the President and shall perform the duties of the President in the absence or disability of that officer to act.

Section 3 - The Secretary shall record the minutes of all minutes of the SDCA membership meetings and of the Board of Directors which shall be published in the

South Dakota Chess Association Bulletin and shall perform such other duties as may be delegated to him.

Section 4 - The Treasurer shall have custody of all of the funds of the SDCA; shall keep a full and accurate account of receipts and expenditures; and shall make disbursements as authorized by the SDCA Board of Directors or a special committee. The Treasurer shall present a financial statement at every meeting of the SDCA and at other times when requested by the Board of Directors and shall make a full reports at the annual meeting. A copy of the reports of the Treasurer shall printed in the South Dakota Chess Association Bulletin. The Treasurer shall be responsible for the maintenance of such books and records as are required normal accounting practices.

ARTICLE VIII Meetings

Section 1 - The annual meeting of members of the Association shall be held on the Sunday morning of the South Dakota Team Tournament. Notice of the time and place of holding the annual meeting shall be mailed to each voting member at least ten days previous thereto in the South Dakota Chess Association Bulletin.

Section 2 - Special meeting of members shall be called by the President at any time on his own initiative or Secretary upon the request of five members to such officer in writing. Notice of the meeting shall be mailed to each member at least ten days previous to the meeting in the South Dakota Chess Association Bulletin and at such special meeting there shall only be considered such business as is specified in the notice of meeting.

Section 3 - At all meetings of the Association, the order of business shall be as follows:

- (a) Reading of minutes of the immediate prior meeting for information and approval.
- (b) Reports of Officers
- (c) Reports of Committees
- (d) Election of Directors and Officers
- (e) Unfinished Business
- (f) New Business
- (g) Reading and approval of minutes of meeting just held, if requested.

Section 4 - Meetings of the Board of Directors shall be called by the President on his own initiative whenever in his judgment, it may be necessary, or by the Secretary upon request of any three members of the Board of Directors. Two weeks notice of meetings shall be sent to all directors, and shall include the date, time, place and reasons for the meeting.

Section 5 - A majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum.

Section 6 - The Secretary-Treasurer of the SDCA shall be responsible for parliamentary procedures. Unless otherwise stated in the Constitution and Bylaws or amendments thereto, Roberts Rules of Order govern the conduct of all meetings of the SDCA and its Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IX Powers

The SDCA shall have all of the powers granted to corporations under the laws of the State of South Dakota. However, notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the SDCA shall exercise such powers as are in furtherance of the exempt purposes of organization set forth in the subsection of Section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 under which the SDCA may wish to qualify for exemption, as the same now exists or as it may be amended from time to time.

ARTICLE X Amendment

The Constitution and Bylaws of the SDCA may be amended by a majority vote of the voting members present at an Annual or Special Meeting.

ARTICLE XI Dissolution

Upon termination, dissolution or winding up of the the SDCA in any manner or for any reason, its assets, if any, remaining after payment (or provision for payment) of all liabilities of the SDCA shall be distributed to, and only to, one or more organizations having either exclusively charitable, religious, scientific or educational purposes or a primary purpose to promote social welfare or only for exempt purposes as described in Sections 501(c)(3) and (4) of the Code.

ARTICLE XII Registered Agent and Office

The President of the SDCA shall be the registered agent for the SDCA and his address shall be the registered office of the SDCA under the laws of the State of South Dakota and the address of the SDCA for the purposes of the United States Chess Federation.

BY-LAWS OF THE SOUTH DAKOTA CHESS ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I Definitions

Section I. The following words when used in the Constitution of the South Dakota Chess Association, or any amendments thereto; and in the By-laws of the Association or any amendments thereto (unless the context shall prohibit) shall have the following meanings.

- (a) Association or SDCA shall mean and refer to the SOUTH DAKOTA CHESS ASSOCIATION, A South Dakota organization affiliated with the United States Chess Federation (USCF) -- formed to promote chess in South Dakota.
- (b) Constitution shall mean and refer to Constitution of the Association, or any amendments thereto, or any Re-Stated Constitution of the Association.
- (c) By-Laws shall mean and refer to the By-Laws of the Association or any amendments thereto.
- (d) Board shall mean and refer to the Board of Directors of the Association.
- (e) Member shall mean and refer to any person who is a member in good standing of the Association and who fulfills the requirements for residents as stated in the Constitution or By-Laws or as the requirements therein may from time to time be changed.

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP

Section I. The members of the Association shall at all times be the same persons who meet the requirements set forth in these By-Laws and shall be afforded all

rights and privileges as herein stated.

Section 2. There shall be two classes of members: voting and non-voting.

Section 3. The qualifications for voting members and non-voting members are set forth in Article III of these By-Laws.

ARTICLE III QUALIFICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Voting members. Voting members of the Association shall meet one or more of the following requirements.

(a) Residency. A voting member of the Association shall have:

- (i) a permanent residence in the State of South Dakota
 - (ii) official voter registration, if any , or automobile registration, if any, in the State of South Dakota.
 - (iii) in case of full-time students who attend out-of-state institutions, substantial financial dependence upon persons who fulfill the requirements of paragraphs (i) and (ii).
 - (iv) is permanently assigned to military duty in South Dakota.
- The Secretary-Treasurer of the Association shall determine if current or proposed members meet the requirements of residency.

(b)Dues. A voting member of the Association shall maintain status in the Association by paying dues to the Secretary-Treasurer as the Secretary-Treasurer fulfills the requirements of Article V of these By-Laws.

Section 2. Non-voting members. Non-voting members of the Association shall be the persons who do not fulfill the requirements of Section 1 but who

(a)are voting members of chartered, USCF affiliated and recognized state chess association other than SDCA; and/or

(b)pay dues to SDCA as prescribed in Article IV of these By-Laws.

Section 3. USCF Membership. All members shall also be members of the United States Chess Federation.

ARTICLE IV DUES

Section 1. There are hereby established dues for membership in the South Dakota Chess Association.

Section 2. Dues for all members shall conform to the following schedules:

(a)Junior members -- those who have not reached their twentieth birthday --shall be assessed six dollars (\$6) per year.

(b)Regular members -- those who have reached their twentieth birthday -- shall be assessed ten dollars (\$10) per year.

(c) Family memberships -- for those who have more than one membership per household shall be assessed fifteen dollars (\$15) per year for all memberships in that household.

(d) All members shall receive and maintain a membership card which shall indicate the expiration date of the current Association membership. A request for a replacement card or missing membership card shall be accompanied by a fee of one dollar.

(All memberships will expire on December 31 of each year. Memberships paid for after the Closed will be assessed at one half the normal cost.

ARTICLE V RIGHTS OF MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Members of the Association shall be allowed to play in all USCF rated tournaments held in the State of South Dakota, provided that proof of membership is presented to the tournament director prior to registration except that only voting members shall participate in the annual state championship tournament as specified in Section 3 subsection of this Article.

Section 2. All members of the Association who have paid dues as prescribed in Article IV shall receive the SDCA Bulletin. The family membership entitles the family to one copy of each SDCA Bulletin.

Section 3. Voting members only shall:

(a) elect Association officers and District Coordinators pursuant to Article VI of the Constitution of the Association.

(b) vote on proposed amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Association pursuant to Article IX of the Constitution of the Association

(c) participate in the annual state championship tournament;

(d) have privileges as officers or district coordinators of the Association from time to time.

ARTICLE VI TOURNAMENTS

Section 1. Scheduling of Tournaments. The Board of Directors by resolution duly adopted shall prepare and distribute in the SDCA bulletin an annual schedule of tournaments to be held in the State of South Dakota in which tournaments all members of the Association are eligible to play after appropriate consultation with all certified tournament directors in the State.

Section 2. Notification of Tournaments. All certified tournament directors shall notify the editor of the South Dakota Chess Association Bulletin of tournaments in which all members of the Association are eligible to play before the bulletin deadline. The Bulletin editor will publish such notifications of tournaments in the SDCA Bulletin. Notification shall include specific information on dates, location,

fees, rounds, time control, and special conditions if any.

Section 3. Reports of Tournaments. All certified tournament directors who conduct tournaments in which all members of the Association are eligible to play shall submit a report to the editor of the SDCA bulletin including a crosstable of results within fifteen (15) days of the completion of the tournament and shall submit any membership dues received together with a report showing the name, address, amount paid and age of the payor to the Secretary-Treasurer within fifteen (15) days of the receipt of the dues.

Section 4. Eligibility of Participants . All certified tournament directors who conduct tournaments in which members are eligible to play shall assure that all participants meet eligibility requirements as set forth in the By-Laws. The Secretary-Treasurer shall be responsible determining eligibility and receiving dues at tournaments which he attends. The Secretary-Treasurer shall upon request furnish a current membership list to any certified tournament director conducting a tournament in which membership in the Association is required.

(a)The director(s) of the annual state championship tournament shall assure that all participants meet the requirements for voting members as set forth in ARTICLE III,Section I,Subsection (a).

Section 5. New USCF memberships received at tournaments. Tournament directors may discretionarily use state affiliate commission reimbursement from new USCF memberships for new members benefit or for tournament expenses.

Section 6. Specification for the Annual State Championship Tournament.

In case of a tie in the State Championship or the Junior State Championship a playoff will be held at the time control of Game/30 until a winner is determined. This time control may be shortened or lengthened with the unanimous consent of the playoff participants

(b)The eligibility for play in the State Junior Championship will be determined by the age of the player at the time of the tournament.

The playing site for the South Dakota State Championship will be rotated -- place to set by the Board of Directors.

The Junior Championship title will be awarded to the Junior player who places highest at the South Dakota Closed Championship. If a Junior player wins the tournament, he will be awarded both titles.

Section 7. For SDCA-sponsored tournaments, the SDCA will supply the tournament director with tournament supplies (i.e.scoresheets, pairing cards,etc.)

Section 8. At SDCA sponsored tournaments the entry fees will be waived for 1st time tournament entrants. The player must pay both USCF and SDCA dues to qualify for these benefits. Family memberships will be excepted from this requirement. Amounts waived by the tournament dircectors shall be reimbursed to them by the SDCA.

Section 9. The SDCA shall neither award nor recognize any state chess titles that are decided by a playoff match held at a time control shorter than Game/30, unless unanimous consent of the playoff participants is obtained.

Section 10. The SDCA shall neither award nor recognize any state chess titles that are decided by competition that is not open to all residents of South Dakota regardless of USCF rating - with the exception that the SDCA may award and recognize state class champions in competition restricted to specific rating classes.

Section 11. The SDCA will compensate the tournament director directing the South Dakota Team Championship and the South Dakota Closed. The fee will be \$50 per tournament for directing. The director will receive an additional \$150 per tournament for expenses if the tournament is held "out of town".

ARTICLE VII SCHOLASTIC CHESS

Section 1. The SDCA shall establish a committee to be in charge of scholastic chess in the State of South Dakota.

Section 2. The SDCA shall conduct such scholastic-only tournaments as are deemed necessary by the committee on scholastic chess. No scholastic player entering these scholastic-only tournaments shall be required to pay any membership dues for the SDCA .

Section 3. The SDCA shall conduct a scholastic-only State Championship tournament. This tournament shall consist of high school division, a junior high school or middle school division and an elementary division. Other sections may be added at the discretion of the tournament director. The winner of the high school section of the tournament shall receive the title of State High School Champion. The highest finisher meeting eligibility requirements shall be entitled to represent the State of South Dakota in the Arnold Denker Tournament of High School Championships. In case of a tie if more than one player wants to attend the Arnold Denker tournament the players shall compete in a playoff until a winner is determined. The SDCA shall provide the winner with an amount of money to be determined at the annual meeting to assist him with his expenses associated with the Arnold Denker Tournament of High School Champions.

Section 4. The SDCA President will certify/define home school teams for state competition purposes.

Section 5. The State Scholastic Championship will be a closed tournament open only to residents of South Dakota as defined in Article III, Section 1 (a) of the Bylaws.

ARTICLE VIII SOUTH DAKOTA CHESS ASSOCIATION BULLETIN

Section 1. The South Dakota Chess Association Bulletin is designated as the official publication of the South Dakota Chess Association.

Section 2. The editor of the South Dakota Chess Association Bulletin shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors of the SDCA.

Section 3. The SDCA Bulletin will be published quarterly at the discretion of the editor. Deadlines for submitting games, tournament information or other items of interest to the Bulletin Editor will be March 1, May 1, August 1 and December 1.

Section 4. The SDCA Bulletin shall be financed from the funds of the SDCA.

Section 5. All notices required in Constitution or the By-Laws shall be sufficient within the required notice time when published in the SDCA Bulletin.

Section 6. The Secretary-Treasurer shall furnish to the editor a list of all current members and their addresses.

Section 7. The editor shall notify all of members of the expiration of their membership in the issues of the Bulletin immediately preceding and immediately following the expiration of their membership.

Section 8. The editor shall be entitled to the assistance of all Board members of the SDCA and all certified tournament directors in the preparation of the SDCA Bulletin.
